Dear Future PSYC 320 Students,

Taking this course was one of my most positive experiences in my four years at UBC. As a Women's Studies major I am constantly learning about and discussing a variety of gender and inequality issues. PSYC 320 was an important addition to my studies because I was able to learn about these issues on a more day to day or real life basis.

So many different topics came up in the class and even more arouse out of the discussion panels and teleconferences. Classmates brought up so many important issues, funny stories, and real life experiences that I hadn't considered, or I could identify with. To me, this gave the course a real credibility. Through the Looking Glass (Brightly)

Gender issues, problems and inequalities surround us. In one of my journals, I described several 'snapshots' I have in my head about such gender inequalities. These snapshots include vivid scenes or incidences I have witnessed in my travels, and in my life. I have many such snapshots in my memory album – of inequalities, of

social injustices and of inequalities in power, as does everyone. One does not need to take a course on gender to realize, for instance, how little women, in particular, are valued in countries like China, India and Russia. Snapshots such as the ones I've witnessed evoke emotion, sadness and tears in all but the hardest of hearts. However, in taking a gender course such as this one, those snapshots are brought into sharper

focus; the inequalities become more vivid; and the plight of women, in particular, remains in the forefront. In the past I would run the snapshots in my head and feel the sadness, the tears, and the empathy for women and children who are relegated to such a life. It is easy however, to stop bringing those snapshots to the forefront; it is easy to evoke them less and less until they eventually dim and fade from memory just like a real snapshot does. I never want that to happen. Taking this gender course has helped me to continue to keep those snapshots in the forefront but with a different bent; I now interpret, question and analyze

these snapshots in more detail. I bring, to these

snapshots, the "why" and the "how" and the "what can be done about it". That is not to say that I have come up with solutions. I'm still questioning and analyzing, but my awareness of the incredible inequalities that exist has increased sharply. I have done a lot more reading on this subject. I still don't know how this information will help in searching for solutions to very complex issues, but I do know that knowledge,

information and awareness are good starting points, and this gender course has helped me immensely in that path.

I know I've traveled a long, more enlightened road to gender awareness in the last five months. The journey has included the readings, naturally. But more importantly, the journey has taken me into the minds of other people who have differing opinions and beliefs about gender. These varied opinions have enriched my own thoughts about gender, and has contributed to my overall understanding of gender issues. By sharing

ideas, opinions and beliefs about gender, we are all raising our awareness. This course has been the perfect medium for that especially since it is an on-line course. I feel that the anonymity it offers allows participants to be freer in voicing their opinions, and hence one gets a truer perspective of what is 'out there', and one gains a better insight into how other people think. Be aware that it can be a very frustrating and at times, upsetting process. When faced with the reality of some of the power struggles that should really not be in existence, the entrenched, outdated beliefs that still hold such undeserved power, let alone encourage the oppression that is still very much a part of even our western society. Dear Future Students of Psychology 320,

Looking back at what I originally thought this course would be and where I have come to now that this course is winding down, I can see that I was so wrong and so right at the same time. If I were to summarise this course, I would have to say that it is a roller-coaster ride of exploration and confrontation that will greet you at the most unexpected corners of your conceptualisation of gender. That is, of course, if you are up to the task.

From a purely academic perspective, the readings and discussions resulted in a total debunking of myths that I held so dear to my identity as a woman and a person. And I didn't even know that they were so dear! Conversely, where I expected my opinions to change or to experience the most growth didn't come to fruition...either I knew more than I thought, or I was still reeling from my 'aha!' moments. Of course, hindsight is 20/20 and it's only now at the end of this course that I can see how everything falls together.

One of my biggest changes is that I originally saw the social forces at work as a sort of 'big brother' that brainwashed us, when in fact, these forces are very close to home and they lack malicious intent to conform our identities, as I had thought. Gender sits with me a lot differently and it will be an ongoing process

to digest all that I have learned.

In my self-exploration and discussion with other students, I was able to process my anger and confusion and temper it with the fact that these are views of the individual. Putting it more bluntly, I have had very different experiences with gender than other students, and I am amazed that they can have such radically different views. I think that is very important to keep in mind: we are all affected by 'genderisation', but we are not affected equally. Enjoy!

When I began this course I came in with an open mind. I also was not completely ignorant of many of the issues that were discussed in the course. With that said, I still learned a great deal from this course about gender issues in society, in others taking the course, and in myself. I could summarize all of what I can recall learning in this course, but that would be boring! Instead, I will focus on a couple of what I take to be the most important outcomes of this

course.

First, through the process of journaling my thoughts on gender-related issues, I gained greater insight into myself. By culling memories and events from my childhood and adolescence looking for evidence of gender socialization, I gained a richer sense of self through developing a greater understanding of my past. The kind of self-knowledge I achieved in this course has helped me to more clearly understand why I did, thought, and felt certain (sometimes bizarre) things over the years. Journaling enabled me to gain insight into the way that I previously and currently experience the world, and that is, to say the least, pretty neat.

Perhaps more importantly, the insight gained through this course will help me to have a greater sense of independence and autonomy of action now and in the future. Genderization helps to determine our actions. By understanding how genderization determines our actions we then suddenly seem to have more choice in life. How valuable is that? Priceless.

Finally, through participating in the online discussion forums, I developed a strong sense of hope in the possibilities of positive change for the future —change in the direction of greater equality among people regardless of gender. My optimism results from reading the many extremely intelligent comments and questions from my mostly female classmates. The voices in the forums and in the teleconferences were filled with passion, confidence, and in some cases wisdom. The fact that there are such amazing women out there of varying ages and backgrounds makes me think that changes in society, however slow, are happening and will continue to happen. That there were such liberal-minded men in the course was also guite heartening.

I can hardly think of better things to get out of a course than a greater sense of personal freedom of thought and of action, and a greater sense of hope for the future of society. Needless to say, I highly recommend this course to others and will continue to do so in the future.

I also discovered that it has effected me in so many ways, as part of what has been so brilliant about this course for me is that with the material we are encouraged to share our "personal" and "social" observations. That makes understanding these concepts so real, interesting and relevant.

It was a struggle for me to "open up" through the journaling and discussion boards, but when I took the risk and started exploring really honestly and deeply it became a transformation for me, unlike any experience I have had in University. I found through all the material, the texts and online that I would become enraged and depressed at some of the brutal realities people are subjected to under the "gender flag." Many times I cried reading stories and learning things that made me feel like I was a part of something bigger.

The Kilmarten text has been the source of much personal and scholastic information for me. I love the Phenomenological perspective and plan to lend the book to all of the men in my life with the hope that they can heal some of the pain and scars of the institution of "manhood".
